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EUCCHARISTIC MIRACLES

Eucharistic miracles have been happening for centuries in different countries around the world. Some of these miracles have even happened in our lifetime. The Catholic Church goes through a thorough process to determine whether a Eucharistic miracle is valid. However, even when Eucharistic miracles are approved and officially recognized by the Catholic Church, Catholics are not obligated to believe in them.

The following are approved Eucharistic miracles by the Catholic Church:

In 750 A.D., at the Church of St. Francis in Lanciano, Italy, "A monastic priest doubted whether the Body of Our Lord was truly present in the consecrated Host. He celebrated Mass and, when he pronounced the words of consecration, he saw the Host turn into Flesh and the wine turn into Blood. All this was shown to those present. The Flesh is still intact and the Blood is divided into 5 unequal parts which together weigh the same as *each one* does separately." Fast forward to 1970: In 1970, Dr. Edward Linoli did a scientific examination on the relics of the Lanciano miracle that happened in 750 A.D. and found them to be human flesh and blood. The blood type was AB, which is the same blood type found on the Shroud of Turin.

In 1227, in Rimini, Italy, St. Anthony of Padua was challenged by Bonovillo, a heretic, to prove the truth of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. In a biography of St. Anthony, here are the exact words of Bonovillo: "Friar! I tell you before all these people: I will believe in the Eucharist if my mule, after 3 days with no food, adores the Host which you offer him rather than eating the fodder I give him." After not being fed for 3 days, the mule refused to eat the food and instead, bent down before the Host. From that day forward, Bonovillo believed in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

In 1906, a tsunami came towards the island of Tumaco, Columbia. Fr. Gerard Larrondo and Fr. Julian lead people in a procession with the Blessed Sacrament to the sea shore. As the huge wall of water quickly approached the beach, Fr. Larrondo walked to the edge of the water, raised the monstrance with the Sacred Host, and traced the Sign of the Cross in the air. The huge wall of water that could have destroyed all of them, suddenly stopped and began to recede. Then the sea returned to its normal level. The

priests and all the people said prayers of thanksgiving to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament for saving them from death. (*This miracle reminded me of Jesus calming the stormy sea and strong winds when His apostles were in a boat on the Sea of Galilee.*)

These are just 3 Eucharistic miracles in the book, "The Eucharistic Miracles of the World". This book was written and published because of the research and cataloguing done on the computer by a young Italian boy named Carlo Acutis. Carlo created a website about Eucharistic Miracles and completed it in 2005. He wanted to share his love of Jesus through the Holy Eucharist and wanted everyone to believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. In 2006, Carlo was diagnosed with leukemia and died on October 12, 2006, when he was only 15 years old. The cause for sainthood is currently in the process for Carlo Acutis.
