Economic Policy Issues

The market runs according to commutative justice, that is between giving and receiving parties. But the church also stresses distributive and social justice, always with the common good in mind, always according to proper ethics. Transparency, honesty, and responsibility have to be maintained.

God has a place in the public realm. Religion must not be excluded. Subsidiarity is the guiding principle among believers and non-believers also. When a group cannot achieve a goal on its own, a higher authority must assist.

Development aid has to be seen as a valid means for creating wealth for all. An example is to permit citizens to decide how to allocate state taxes. Only those who are in tune with the common good can help to affect the common good. This does not always include politicians, but only politicians intent on providing the best for everyone.

Unfortunately some decide that in mastering in vitro fertilization, embryo research, and the making of clones and human embryos, they have mastered every mystery. This is dealing with the culture of death instead of human dignity.

Here are four important economic policies:

- Employment is a basic right; work and private ownership of property are central to the freedom and well-being of people
- Poverty affects especially children and racial minorities
- Farmers often leave their land and rural communities decay, leaving farm lands unfit for cultivation and planting crops
- Wealthy nations demand that poorer nations pay their debts leaving the poor without food and sustenance. Wealthy nations have responsibility to be brother to the poor

- ❖ Minutes of the July, 2016 meeting were approved as corrected.
- ❖ The group reviewed the financial report for July reflecting \$14,095.03 in income and \$21,526.39 in expenses for a deficit of \$7,431.36. The balance sheet showed assets of \$458,669.34 compared to \$905,307.77 at the end of July 2015, this reflects the building fund account.
- ❖ David Zecha and Tom Giessel shared prints of the parking lot and where pole lights and sidewalks will be placed.
- ❖ David and Tom gave a presentation for upgrading the lighting in our church on the recommendation of PKMR Engineers and Haynes Electric. The lights would be replaced with LED fixtures adding more brightness to areas in the sanctuary, nave and choir loft. The project would take 4 to 6 weeks. It was moved and seconded to move forward with Haynes Electrics bid following the approval of Bishop Brungardt.

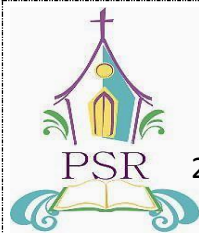

(For parents of PSR children & those who can't make Sundays)

In these sessions, Bishop Barron gives us an in-depth study on the Eucharist, the "source and summit of the Christian life." We will examine three important aspects of this inexhaustibly rich Sacrament: the Eucharist as sacred meal, as sacrifice, and as real presence. These elements unite the Church across time and untie us to our fellow Catholics in every sacred liturgy.

The study is designed to help us apply to our lives what we will learn from Bishop Barron's look at the Catholic Tradition. The aim is to help us study, reflect upon and act in obedience to the will of God in Christ. A study guide will be provided for each person who registers. Besides our *Catholic Tradition*, the study also includes *Scripture* and references the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (CCC). Please bring your Bible with you to the sessions. The CCC references will be provided. These materials will help us to assess and enhance our lives as disciples of Jesus Christ. As in the Lenten Program of 2016, we will view a video of Bishop Barron's presentations on the Eucharist drawing us into the depth of its beauty and meaning, then break into small groups for discussion and sharing.

Registration forms will be in the August 27/28 bulletins or are available in the parish office. Please return forms by September 11th to the parish office or place in the weekend collection baskets.

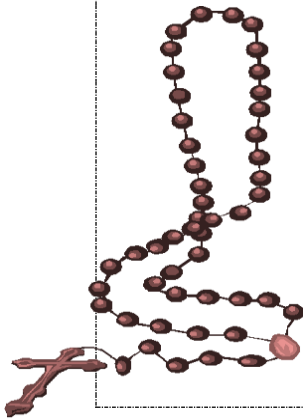
