



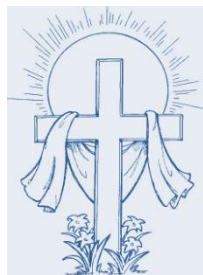

Particular Judgement

Death takes on a completely new meaning for those who have united themselves to Christ through the sacraments. A Christian's death – although sorrowful, like Our Lord's death – is ultimately a cause for joy. Death is the moment when we will meet our Savior face to face. Loving and serving God well in

this life will bring us many heavy crosses. Death will be a sweet release from the sufferings of this life, by which our charity for God and our neighbor will be richly rewarded. The Christian view of death gives us hope, not only for our own deaths, but also for our loved ones whom we prayerfully entrust to God's mercy.

Our earthly life is given to us as our opportunity to draw closer to God, and to make use of the graces He gives us to live holy lives. But this gift is not infinite. After death there will be no opportunity to choose differently. We won't have any more time to build virtue in our souls or to repent of our sins. We must use our lives to draw close to God before our lives end, since we will take into the next life everything that we accumulated in our souls while we lived.

That state of our soul at the time of our death is permanent, and it is in this state that we will face our judgement. How we lived our lives, whether for God or for ourselves, will determine what happens to our souls when we die.

Scripture teaches us that our eternal destiny will be decided immediately at the moment of our death – our soul will be laid bare before Jesus Christ. This is called the particular judgement because it is the judgement of each individual soul at the end of its earthly life. This distinguishes it from the general or final judgement that will take place publicly at the end of time.

What a soul experiences at death and its particular judgement will not be the same for all. The experience will either be joyful or terrible, depending on whether the soul died as a friend or as an enemy of God. Blessed John Henry Newman noted "When we come into God's presence, we shall be asked 2 things, whether we were in the Church, and whether we worked in the Church. Everything else is worthless...The single question will be, are we Catholics and are we good Catholics?"

- ❖ Minutes of the May meeting were approved as presented.
- ❖ The group reviewed the financial report for May reflecting \$22,828.49 in income and \$17,865.24 in expenses for a net income of \$4,963.25. The balance sheet showed assets of \$477,264.37.
- ❖ Security Cameras for the Church have been on backorder and should be in within the next few weeks.
- ❖ Dave gave a bid received from C & V Home Improvement/Kansas Doors for replacement windows, screens and screen door on the rectory. A motion was made and passed to go forward with the repair.
- ❖ Dave reported that water continues to be in the church basement following rains. We are still waiting on a bid from Eakin Concrete on replacing the driveway. Dave also discovered the sump pump was not working properly. The sump pump has been replaced.
- ❖ The defibrillators are installed. (One in the church and one at the parish center). A handful of people attended the training. Pam shared that the defibrillators will talk you thru what to do.
- ❖ Bev Howell thanked us for the honor of restoring and sealing the murals in the church vestibule. The process will take several months to complete. They were last worked on in 1999. Bev mentioned that we should really invest in a protective coating for the windows. This would stop the sun from deteriorating the paintings.
- ❖ A new parish pictorial directory is in the works. The last one was over six years ago. The printing will cost \$50 for the setup and \$5 per book. Dave moved to pay the \$5 per book fee for the parishioner's that have their picture taken. Motion passed.

Health Dept. and PAT receive at least 10 calls per year each and both have places they could store diapers if they were available. The National Diaper Bank is sponsored by Huggies and unless there is a real benefit to working through NDB, we may consider doing the project on our own.

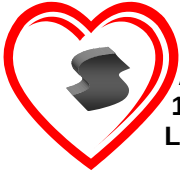
