LECTIO DIVINA



In Christianity, *Lectio Divina* (Latin for *divine reading*) is a traditional Catholic practice of scriptural reading, meditation and prayer intended to promote communion with God and to increase the knowledge of God's Word. It does not treat Scripture as texts to be studied, but as the Living Word.

Traditionally *Lectio Divina* has 4 separate steps: read (*lectio*), meditate (*meditatio*), pray (*oratio*) and contemplate (*contemplatio*).

Father Richard Rohr describes *Lectio Divina* as a contemplative way to read short passages of sacred text. He says: With the first reading, listen with your heart's ear for a phrase or word that stands out for you. During the second reading, reflect on what touches you, perhaps speaking that response aloud or writing in a journal. After reading the passage a third time, respond with a prayer or expression of what you have experienced and what it calls you to. Finally, rest in silence after a fourth reading. He invites us to practice *lectio divina* with this ancient love song: Song of Songs 6:9-12, 7:10-14, 8:6-7.

For those of you who joined us for "Prayer: Finding Intimacy With God", taught by Tim Gray during our Lenten Study in 2019, this is not new. The focus of *Lectio Divina* is not a theological analysis of biblical passages but viewing them with Christ as the key to their meaning. This form of meditative prayer leads to an increased knowledge of Christ.

The roots of Scriptural reflection and interpretation go back to Origen in the 3rd century. St. Ambrose taught them to St. Augustine. The monastic practice of *Lectio Divina* was first established in the 6th century by Saint Benedict who said, "*Christianity is not simply a creed, but rather an encounter with the living God.*" It was then formalized as a 4 step process by the Carthusian monk, Guigo II in the 12th century, who used the image of rungs on a ladder to describe this method of prayer. In the 20th century, the constitution *Dei Verbum* of Pope Paul VI recommended *Lectio Divina* for the general public. Pope Benedict XVI emphasized the importance of *Lectio Divina* in the 21st century.

You may want to practice this form of prayer as outlined by Father Richard Rohr, and you may also wish to order the New *Lectio Divina of the Gospels (Reading, Meditation, Prayer, Contemplation)* for the Liturgical Year 2019-2020 which is now available at store.usccb.org for \$15.95. *This book takes the reader through a cycle of praying with the Gospels for Sundays and major feasts of the liturgical year, beginning with the First Sunday of Advent on December 1, 2019, and concluding with the Solemnity of Our Lord*

Jesus Christ, King of the Universe on November 22, 2020.

- ❖ Minutes of the July meeting were approved as presented.
- ❖ The group reviewed the financial report for July reflecting \$25,369.26 in income and \$24,806.67 in expenses for a gain of \$562.59. The July balance sheet showed assets of \$491,258.88 compared to \$500,268.61 at the end of July 2018.
- ❖ Mary Mitchell informed the commission that the Formed website subscription is due in October. There are 35 people currently signed up. All the study groups and PSR use the website. The council will discuss renewing it at the next meeting.
- ❖ The rectory driveway and elevated sidewalk project is complete.
- ❖ A bid was received for a service contract from Trane in Wichita for the HVAC system in Church. The council approved to accept a 5 year contract option.
- ❖ A Helping Hands director has been hired and a request has been sent to all area Churches for financial support to help offset her salary. A motion was made and passed to reinstate a monthly stipend.

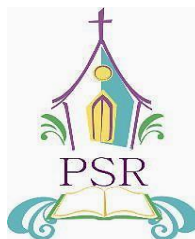
PASTORAL COUNCIL

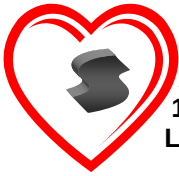
